2010 UQ Tennis Club Sizzling Summer Saturday Night Tournament Series - CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. These tournaments are approved by Tennis Queensland and shall be conducted in accordance with the Rules of the Game adopted by Tennis Australia, the Tournament Rules & Regulations laid down by Tennis Queensland, the Tennis Australia Code of Behaviour and the UQTC Code of Conduct.
- 2. For the Doubes Tournament on 16 January and the Mixed Doubles Tournament on 6 February, entry is restricted to players who are 2010 members of The University of Queensland Tennis Club Inc. (UQTC). For the Singles Tournament on 20 February, which is being run in conjunction with the Brisbane Night Tennis Association Inc. (BNTA), entry is restricted to players who are 2010 members of the UQTC or 2010 members of the BNTA.
- 3. The Tournament Management Committee, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee", shall have the entire control and management of the tournament. Any matter not specifically covered by these Conditions shall be resolved by the Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 4. Entries must be submitted on the prescribed entry form. Each player must complete a separate entry form which must be completed in full, signed to confirm acceptance of the Tournament Conditions and lodged with the entry fees by 11 p.m. on the Thursday before each tournament. The entry form may be used to enter a single tournament or multiple tournaments in the Series. Entries must be sent to the UQ Tennis Club. Depending on how the entry is lodged, payment may be made by Cash, Cheque, Money Order, Credit Card (credit card service fee applies) or Debit Card (debit card service fee applies). If paying by cheque or money order, make payable to the UQ Tennis Club. Entries may be hand delivered; posted to the UQ Tennis Club, PO Box 6005, St Lucia, Qld 4067; faxed to 3870 5002 (with credit card payment); e-mailed to admin@uqtc.org.au (with credit card payment); or lodged on-line with credit card payment at http://tournaments.tennis.com.au (fees listed for on-line entry include the ActiveNetwork on-line processing fee).
- 5. All entries will be confirmed by e-mail (where an e-mail address is supplied). Players who do not receive such confirmation by 5 p.m. on the Friday before each tournament should contact the UQ Tennis Club (Ph 3371 4974, Fax 3870 5002, E-Mail admin@uqtc.org.au). Players who believe they have entered, but do not receive confirmation, have no claim on a position in the draw unless they contact the UQ Tennis Club by 1 p.m. on the day of the tournament. Entries can be checked on-line at http://tournaments.tennis.com.au.
- 6. Entries in the Men's Doubles & Ladies' Doubles Tournament on 16 January and the Mixed Doubles Tournament on 6 February will only be accepted if a Doubles partner is named and that partner also lodges an entry form with all fees
- 7. Any player may withdraw prior to the draw being made and the entry fee less relevant administrative expenses shall be refunded. No entry fees shall be refunded where a player is defaulted or where a player withdraws after being placed in the draw.
- 8. Players may enter in events at any level equal to or above the level for which they are eligible. Event eligibility shall be decided on the basis of the ITNs or provisional ITNs allocated by the Club Grading Committee and the Committee reserves the right to transfer any player to a higher grade if it deems a player is above the designated standard for the level entered. Any player who does not nominate a level shall be entered in the event equivalent to his/her ITN. Where partners in Doubles events are of different standards, event eligibility shall be decided on the basis of the highest standard.
- 9. The tournaments will offer events at four levels: Open (open to players of all levels), A Grade (restricted to members equivalent to or lower than ITN 5), B Grade (restricted to members equivalent to or lower than ITN 6) and C Grade (restricted to members equivalent to or lower than ITN 7). However, depending on entry numbers, the Committee reserves the right to cancel any event or amalgamate events, to divide any event into sections and to determine the number of prizes to be awarded.
- 10. As a guide for eligibility, <u>approx</u> grade cut-offs are set out in the List of Events (overleaf). Because of the difficulty of describing event eligibility based on Fixture grades, particularly where there are a just a few grades covering a wide range of standards (e.g. BNTA Tuesday Special), the listed grade cut-offs are very much a guideline only and the Committee reserves the right to transfer any player to a higher grade if it deems a player is above the designated standard for the grade entered. Entrants must supply details of all current Fixture grades. If a player is found to have been allowed to play in too low a grade because of withheld or false information about Fixture grades, that player shall be defaulted and shall not be entitled to any prizes or refund of fees.
- 11. Pairs in the Mixed Doubles must consist of a male and a female. Players in the Men's Singles & Ladies' Singles and Men's Doubles & Ladies' Doubles must enter the event specific for their gender. However, depending on entry numbers, male and female events may be combined for the purpose of providing matches. In this situation, separate male and female winners will still be determined provided there are at least 2 entries of the respective gender.
- 12. The events will be played using round-robin formats which guarantee that all entrants get multiple matches. The exact format for each event will be decided by the Committee when the entry numbers are known.
- 13. Each match shall consist of one set. Sets may be Short Sets, Normal Sets or Pro Sets as announced by the Committee at the start of play. Serve and ends shall be decided by toss. Players shall not change ends during a set. Players shall be permitted a warm-up period of 3 minutes prior to their first match only..
- 14. A Short Set is won by the first player to win 4 games but, if the score reaches 3 games all, a Sudden-Death Tie-Break will be played to decide the set. A Normal Set is won by the first player to win 6 games but, if the score reaches 5 games all, a Sudden-Death Tie-Break will be played to decide the set. A Pro Set is won by the first player to win 9 games but, if the score reaches 8 games all, a Sudden-Death Tie-Break will be played to decide the set.
- 15. In all sets, a sudden-death point is played to decide a game if the score reaches deuce TWICE. The sudden-death point is served to the court nominated by the receiver.
- 16. In the sudden-death Tie-Break, the player whose turn it is to serve, serves two points and, thereafter each player serves two points in rotation and in the same order as previously in the set. This continues until one player/pair reaches 5 points. If the score reaches 4-all, the player who has just served, shall serve the deciding point to the court nominated by the receiver.
- 17. All players must report to the Tournament Office 30 minutes before the scheduled start of play (i.e. by 5:30 p.m. or 6:30 p.m., as the case may be). Entrants not ready to play at 6 p.m. or 7 p.m., as the case may be, may be defaulted. Play will be scheduled to finish at 10:30 p.m. but, if necessary, play may be extended until 11 p.m., or until the lights go out, to complete an event.
- 18. In the event of rain preventing or reducing play on any Saturday, the affected tournament will be played on the following Saturday unless notified otherwise.
- 19. In addition to individual tournament event winners, a male and female Summer Series Winner will be determined using the Grand Prix points scoring system.
